Ciprofloxacin Hydrochloride/ Hydrocortisone	Additional labeler code (00078) restriction added.	July 1, 2022
Ivermectin	Topical lotion end dated.	July 1, 2022
Lamotrigine	Additional formulations (dispersible tablets, ER tablets, & ODT tablets) added.	July 1, 2022
